# M@ssy Bun Cable Hat

### Adult Size

Materials used:

Dutch Brand yarn was used. But you can use just

about any yarn for this hat

Hook: H/5.0mm Tapestry Needle

Stitch Marker (Optional)

## Stitch Abbreviations:


Ch - Chain

SC – Single Crochet

DC – Double Crochet

YO - Yarn Over

Sl st – Slip Stitch



Front Post Treble Crochet (FPTC): Yarn Over (YO) twice, insert hook from front to back around post of stitch indicated. YO and pull up a loop, [YO and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

Back Post Double Crochet (BPDC): YO, insert hook behind post of stitch (insert hook from back to front of stitch), YO, pull up a loop, YO, (pull through 2 loops) twice.

Front Post Double Crochet (FPDC): YO, insert hook behind post of stitch (insert hook from front to back of stitch), YO, pull up a loop, YO, (pull through 2 loops) twice.

#### Notes:

Pattern is worked in multiples of 10

Ch 2 does NOT count as a stitch unless otherwise noted.

### Ribbed Brim:

## Chain 9

R1: Sc in 2nd chain from hook and in each chain across, ch1, turn (8 sc)

R2-60: In back loops only, Sc 1 in second chain from hook and in each chain across (8 sc)

\*If you need it longer keep going til you reach the size you need - just make sure it's in multiples of 10



## **Closing the Brim** –

Bring both ends together and slip stitch down going through both thicknesses. This is your seam so it will be on the inside of your hat.

The Hat Part -

**R1:** Ch 2, work 1 double crochet in same st as Chain 2. Then work 60 dc (or the count you ended up with) evenly as possible around the edge of band. Join with sl st to first dc (60 dc)

**R2:** Ch 2, BPDC around first 2 DC- **Work cabling as follows:** {Skip next 2 dc, FPTC around next 2 DC, working in the skipped stitches FPTC around 1st skipped dc then next dc} BPDC in next 2 sts, FPDC in next 2 sts.

\*BPDC in next two sts. **Work cabling as follows:** {Skip next 2 dc, FPTC around next 2 DC, working in the skipped stitches FPTC around 1st skipped dc then next dc}, BPDC in next 2 sts, FPDC in next 2 sts \*, repeat from \* to \* around, Join with sl st to first BPDC.

(You should have a total of 6 Cables) If you had a count of 70 you'll have 7 Cables etc...

**R3**: Ch 2, BPDC in next 2 stitches, FPDC in next 4 stitches, BPDC in next 2 stitches, FPDC in next 2 stitches, \*BPDC in next 2 stitches, FPDC in next 4 stitches, BPDC in next 2 stitches, FPDC in next 2 stitches, FPDC in next 2 stitches, repeat from \* to \* around, Join with sl st to first BPDC.

**R4**: Repeat Round 3. – You've just completed 1 set of cables

Repeat Rounds 2-4 Three more times. Giving you a set of 4 cables. \*\*\*Tip – keep track of your row\*\*\*

## Finishing off your hat:

R1: sc in next 2 st, dec around, join with sl st to first sc

R2-3: Repeat R1 – Finish Off your work & weave in your ends – you may use the Invisible Join if you'd like to. (Demonstrated in the Video)

If you followed the pattern with the 60 for the brim your stitch count at the end of R3 will be (26) If you had more example 70 – you can do 4 Rows (In video that was made it ended with a stitch count of (23)

\*\*If you want to make a **FULL Hat** just keep decreasing til it gets smaller then Finish Off and sew closed.
